Iverson, Marlowe W. Age 89, of Maplewood, formerly of Edina, passed away at his home on November 29, 2014. Marlowe was born on March 7, 1925 in Minneapolis, MN to Elmer Iverson and Emma Fister. He served in the Navy during WWII, as a Sonarman. On September 4, 1948 he married Bethel Ann Locke. Marlowe was recalled to active duty during the Korean conflict, serving on a destroyer minesweeper. He graduated from the University of Minnesota with a degree in Electrical Engineering and Business Management, and went to work for Honeywell in a career that lasted well over 30 years. During that time, he worked on numerous projects of note, including the Mercury and Apollo space programs. Marlowe was a longtime member of Richfield Lutheran Church, serving as a Sunday school teacher; Bethel Bible study leader; numerous congregational leadership positions; and volunteer church administrator. For the past ten years he and Bethel have been members of Normandale Lutheran in Edina. He had an unwavering belief and faith in his Lord Jesus. He was preceded in death by his parents, and brother Carrol. He is survived by his wife of 66 years, Bethel, sons Robert (Sandra) and Thomas, daughters Marilyn (Ronald) Hudson and Kathy (John) Morris, eight grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren. Visitation will be held at Normandale Lutheran Church, 6100 Normandale Road, on Friday, December 5 from 5:00 - 8:00 p.m. Celebration of life service will be held at the church on Saturday, December 6 at 2:30 p.m., with visitation one hour prior.
