



Maurice (Maury) Anderson

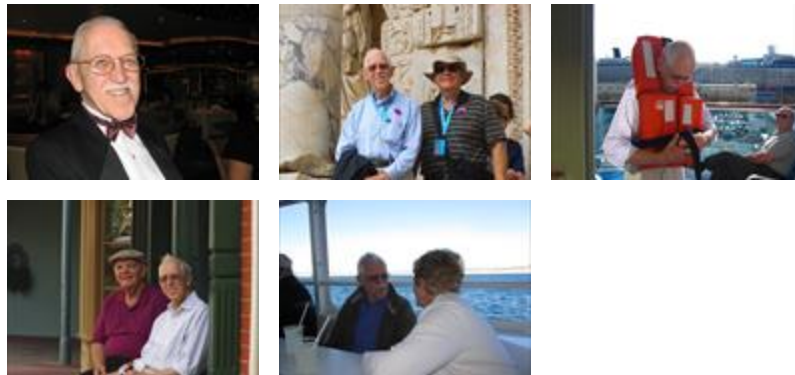
