Strothman Maurice Henry Strothman, age 95, of Minneapolis and Bloomington, on January 9, 2005, lawyer and former First Vice President and Chief Administrative Officer, Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis. Preceded in death by his wife of 57 years, Anne Healy Strothman. Survived by his children John Strothman (Barbara) of Excelsior, Jean Tews (Dixon) of Mahtomedi, Charles Strothman (Barbara) of Tucson, AZ, and Lynne Pilgrim (Ronald) of Chanhassen; nine grandchildren David Strothman (Alyson), Peter Strothman, Jennifer Shultz (Robert), Anne Schwab (Christian), SallyJean Tews Penna (David), Susan Strothman, Sara Strothman (Chris Kachmarzinski), Scott Pilgrim (Kristin), Rebecca Swinney (Michael), and eight great-grand children, Anna, Jack, and Abigail Shultz; Jorie, J.D., Reggie, and Louis Schwab; and Isaac Pilgrim. As a lawyer, banker and citizen Strothman was dedicated to the cause of human rights and equal opportunity. A graduate of the U of M and its Law School, his career spanned the world, focusing primarily on 33 years with the Federal Reserve Bank, retiring as the First Vice President. In his desire to make his Minneapolis community a better place for everyone, Strothman served as chairman of Mayor Naftalin's Commission on Human Relations, president of the Community Health and Welfare Council, director of the United Way, member of the Committee on Foreign Relations, Psi Upsilon, Phi Delta Phi, and pro bono attorney for the Neurofibromatosis Association of MN. He was Commodore of the Calhoun Yacht Club, Race Judge for the Lake Harriet Yacht Club, and member of the Minnetonka Yacht
