



Max Zeman

Zeman, Max age 99, of St. Louis Park, died November 15, 2014, just shy of his 100th birthday. He was preceded in death by his wife of 56 years, Betty; parents, Haskell and Leah; and sisters Betty and Clara. He was a beloved husband, father and grandfather. Max is survived by son, Ed (Jane) Zeman and step-son Mickey Minter; grandchildren, Rachel and Matthew Zeman, Adam (Christine), Amy (Michael) and Aaron Minter. Max was born in Lemberg (Lwów) Poland in 1915. Between 1941 and 1945 Max was drafted and served in the Russian army, Russian civil service and Polish army. In 1945, he was wounded and was discharged from the army. Returning to his home town, he discovered his entire family was killed in the Holocaust. For the next 6 years, Max spent time in hospitals and displaced persons camps until he came to the United States in 1951 to start his life over. He initially settled in St. Paul and trained as an optician where he worked for Soderberg Optical until he retired at age 78. He will be deeply missed by his family and friends.
