Please accept my sincere condolences on Mike's passing. I heard about Mike's death from my brother. It was both very sad news and a real shock.

Mike was my next door neighbor and friend for many years. He and I were raised with an exceptional group of people from McCaskill Elementary/Junior High School in Superior. I have to say, immodestly, it was a precocious group, and Mike was one of the most precocious. We shared the Mercury-Gemini Astronaut Programs, the Cuban Missile Crisis, the Kennedy Assassination, and the Early Civil Rights Movement among other events of the 60s. I remember the discussions about these events being pretty sophisticated for a bunch of little kids. The memories I have of that group are among my most valuable.
