“Gloria/Andrea/Patrick, I know I am not telling you anything you don't already know but Michael was a truly great guy, He will be sorely missed. He has never been very far from my thoughts and especially so this last week since his passing. I don't use the term “great” lightly and would only use to describe a handful of people I have known in my life. Other descriptors for Michael that readily come to mind are talent, boyish enthusiasm, intellect, sense of humor, etc. One of the things I admired most about Michael was how non self-centered and what an “in-check” ego he had for someone with “Capital T” talent in almost every aspect of his life and being. Michael was a great joy to be around and someone you could just talk to and he would always seem to “get it”. Michael was instrumental in getting me to Minnesota and hence nearly everything that has happened in my life since 1980 if you look at it that way (a lot of good things, both personally and professionally). One of the other things that I will forever associate with Michael is just how hard he tried. Not so much perhaps at the things he was already good at but areas where he thought he could improve. Michael was not ashamed or embarrassed to not immediately be great at something and was willing to seek out others who might help him along on his path. To illustrate the point one of the few things that was better than Michael at was tennis and back in the 120 1st Ave North days we would sneak over to the Towers Condos tennis courts over the lunch hour, pick the lock on the gate and smack the ball around. Michael would invariably spray shots all over the place but it didn't deter or discourage him in the least. He was like a big puppy dog.... “Hit me another one!” he'd say and so it went. It didn't matter that balls weren't going in, he just loved the feeling of being outdoors and smacking it. Michael's contributions to both Art and Architectural are voluminous and speak for themselves, but I would still argue that he was a better person than either an artist or architect. The world is a diminished place without him. I will never forget him. My deepest condolences to you and all others who loved him. See you tomorrow.
