April 30, 1932 - June 19, 2024

Magnison, Milton Duaine age 92, of New Brighton, MN passed away on 6/19/24. Preceded in death by wife Gloria (married for 68 years), parents Albert and Edith, brother Alvin (Margaret) and sister Evelyn.
