He was a Board Certified Surgeon in practice at 339 Lowry Medical Clinic for 28 years and Associate Professor of Surgery for the U of MN. He was Chief of Staff at Miller Hospital and United Hospital, lead physician in the merger of Miller and St. Luke's hospitals to form United Hospital. He completed his medical practice at the VA Hospital as Chief of Outpatient Surgery. Neil was a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons, President of the MN Academy of Medicine, member of the MMA, board chair St. Paul Surgical Society and board member MN Surgical Society. He also served as U of MN Alumni Board member. He was actively involved in his churches as council member and building chairperson.
