They drove their Chevys to shows and conventions from coast to coast and always attended "Back to the 50's". Rectal cancer was found and the valiant effort to defeat it began. Norm lived a productive and happy six years after the diagnosis, thanks to Dr. Rob Madoff, Dr. Anne Blaes, the P.A.s, nurses and staff at Masonic Hospital and Infusion Center at the U of MN. He always remained optimistic and never asked, "Why me?" He will be greatly missed by all who knew him.
