Oris Kae McQueen, "Kae," 81, died January 27, 2020 at Folkestone Gables Care Center, Wayzata, Minnesota. A funeral service will be held at 2:00 p.m. Sunday February 2 at Washburn-McReavy Edina Chapel, 5000 W. 50th & Highway 100, Edina, Minnesota, 55436. Visitation will be prior to the funeral at the chapel from 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. A luncheon at the chapel will follow the service.

Kae was born on October 10, 1938, to Frederick and Lavanch (Burton) VanStone in Aberdeen, SD. She graduated from Warner High School, and got her teaching certificate from Northern State College in Aberdeen. Kae moved to Sioux City, Iowa, to begin her teaching career. There she met and married her husband of 31 years, Franklin D. McQueen. They lived together in Sioux City, IA, Le Sueur, MN and Madison Lake, MN. Kae later relocated to Huntley, IL, where she greatly enjoyed her life at Sun City.

Kae was a dedicated teacher, mother and grandmother. She placed a strong priority on civic involvement, and was always actively engaged in community service, from teaching adult basic education to serving as the president of her local quilting guild. Kae was an avid quilter and gardener. She loved attending orchestra and band concerts, and she especially enjoyed playing cards with her friends.

Kae is survived by her sister, Olene Fae Dayton; her children: Anna (David) Linder of Minneapolis, MN, Daniel (Carolyn) McQueen of Pequot Lakes, MN, and Janelle (Carl) Neubaum, of Cary, IL. She is survived by seven grandchildren: Grace Linder, Samuel Linder, Amy Linder, Hannah McQueen, Rebekah McQueen, Roxanne Neubaum and Sophia Neubaum.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Frederick and Lavanch VanStone, her husband, Franklin D. McQueen and her sister, Georgia Mae Wood.
