



Pamela Clarene Johnson

December 30, 1950 - May 1, 2021

Pamela C. Johnson, 70, died peacefully in her sleep from infection complications about 4am Saturday, May 1, 2021 in St. Paul, MN. Born on December 30, 1950 in Porter, MN, she was adopted by Rev. Clarence Johnson and his wife Palma Field in 1951. She was confirmed and baptized in her faith in the Lutheran Church. After moving frequently during childhood, Pam graduated in 1969 from Morris High School, an honor student with distinction. She completed Radiologic Technology School in 1971 and then earned her 4 year BS degree in Med Tech in 1976. Pam began working at the U of MN in 1976 and in 1994 she began specializing in Bone Densitometry. She moved to New York in 2006. Pam participated in many radiologic organizations and served as a speaker, author, instructor and officer. She had a heart for others and twice went to Africa as a medical missionary, in 1982 to Liberia, and in 1992 to Tanzania.

Pam was also a published poet and author, a dedicated musician and awarded a life membership in MSRT, the Minnesota Society of Radiologic Technologists-the state's highest honor.

Her parents preceded her in death; Palma died in 1977 and Clarence died in 1999.

She is survived by her cousins, including Jane (Vaughn) Pals, Blaine (Judy) Field, Brad (Connie) Field, Marshall Field, Helen Euteneuer and several others.

Recently residing at Episcopal Homes in St. Paul for over 2 years, Pam was

earlier diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease in 2014 and suffered a major stroke in 2016 as well as other illnesses and diseases before her death. She will be greatly missed by her friends and family and we remember her with love and gratitude for sharing her life with us but she singing with the heavenly choirs now, at peace at last.
