Pat was active in her church. While at Edina Morningside Congregational church, Pat was elected as the first female moderator in that church's history. She sang in the choir and loved coffee hour after church ended.

Pat was fiercely loyal to her family. No matter the occasion, immediate and extended family were invited. Pat also believed in community and inclusion which led to joyous birthday parties, anniversary parties, potlucks and Christmas get togethers.

Great memories for Pat would include walleye dinners in Warroad; watching Warroad hockey teams in the MN State High School hockey tournament; winters in Port Aransas, TX; time at Quadna in Hill City, MN; attending

children and grandchildren activities; and "breaking even" at the casino.

To her immediate family Pat will be remembered as the best wife; Mom; Mother-in-law; Grandma and Great Grandma that we could have asked for.
