Zacher Patrick William Zacher, age 26, died tragically March 11 of head trauma suffered in an industrial accident. He is survived by his mother Evelyn of Plymouth; father Rev. Patrick was a free spirit, and a wonderful, caring companion to countless friends, co-workers, and family members. His friends have said, "Pat was always there to listen, share, and help in times of need." Our redheaded Irish leprechaun, he enjoyed saying that St. Patrick's Day was his day. Patrick's life was filled with a readiness to give of himself. “ It is one month tomorrow since Patrick passed away, and as the opportunity to write in his Guest Book comes to a close, I need to add my own reflections.

Brant McManigle's words are especially meaningful to me. Little did many of us realize the extent of the gift God had given us in Patrick, or how MANY lives he touched in his brief journey through this world. Even Patrick's rescuers and the nurses at HCMC wept at his passing. The incredible outpouring of love, cards, letters and donations in the past four weeks has been almost incomprehensible - a memorial to Pat that will bring his family and friends comfort for the remainder of our lives.

We know that part of Patrick continues to live in the recipients of his organs. Another part of Patrick will live on in those who benefit from the generous donations to The American Cancer Society, MS, Muscular Dystrophy, the Orono High School Drama Dept., and scholarship funds through the Orono School District and Luther Theological Seminary. But most important, he will live on in each person who loved him: his family, his friends, his co-workers and his beloved Amanda. He will remain with us for as long as we continue to recall the laughter, the things he taught us, the times he was there for us, the crazy things he did, and even some things he would probably rather we DIDN'T remember!

I believe that life does indeed continue into eternity, and I choose to believe that Patrick has reached down from heaven, through all of those who have reached out to bring comfort to the loved ones he left behind here on earth. I believe that Patrick and God together will find a way to ease the aching hearts, and replace the tears with smiles and fond memories.

When my Mother died, she made me promise (fingers crossed behind my back) that I wouldn't "hurt so bad" when she was gone. She said, "I have all of eternity to be sad for you. You be happy for me, because I will be in a better place and free from pain, and we WILL be together again, some day." After all I have heard and read in the past four weeks, I think that is what Patrick would say, too. May we all be comforted in knowing Pat would never have wanted us to "hurt so bad". And may we remember, as Brant said, to be

GRATEFUL for the gift we were given, even though the gift was only ours for a short time.
