“ To the Webster Boys and family, on behalf of the Koch’s, Ralph & Peggy (who have passed on themselves) and their children, Kathy, Jim, John, Jerry & Kelly. We want you to know our hearts go out to you in this time of loss. We were all just little kids living a couple doors down from you on 44th & 3rd for many years. We played “kick the can”; played in the sandbox, the empty lot that was kitty corner, the alleyways and all the places children are not allowed to play anymore. Our Mother’s Mona and Peggy were the best of friends. One of them always knew where we were. And we knew if Mom wasn’t home she was probably over at Mona’s having coffee, making a meal or giving each other perm’s. Now looking at the picture I’ve attached here I see how young they were. Just two women barely 30, each with a houseful of children, raising them the best they could. It’s obvious they were both STRONG women and they didn’t take any nonsense from any of us. Our mom was the disciplinarian and I have a feeling Mona was theirs. They taught us right from wrong and they agreed with each other. I remember when Peggy got a job she got Mona a job there to and when Peggy & Ralph went dancing (which was often) they’d talk John and Mona in to getting a babysitter to join them. Sometimes they’d just combine both families’ children and get 1 sitter but I don’t remember the sitter going for that more than once! THAT’s too many for anyone! Sometimes Mona would go to St. Olafs for mass with Mom as they shared the Catholic faith and the joy of being part of, and having, a large family. We moved away when I was in grade school and although they didn’t see each other as much then they always stayed in touch. Over the last few years, while our mother Peggy laid in a nursing home in Las Vegas with me unable to walk, I would put Mona and Peggy on the phone with each other a couple times a year. Now in their 70’s they would both talk about their grown children and grandchildren and they would reflect on their younger years when they were healthy and sometimes just struggling to get by. I overheard their conversation one afternoon and my mother was asking Mona if she felt they were ever too strict with their children or could have done anything differently. I spoke right up and told my mother that I thought she was a wonderful mother and

*that she should never question this. Mona was on the other end of the phone affirming this and I reiterated that they were both wonderful mothers, so much alike. You would think they knew this but nearing the end of their lives I think they really liked hearing this. Last December when Peggy, my Mom, passed away, I called Mona to tell her. She was sad to hear this and told me of her health problems and she said she probably wouldn't be able to attend the Memorial the next week. We had a very nice talk where she told me about each one of her boys. Then a week later, imagine my surprise when Gary and Cory walked in to Waterston Funeral home. I bet you it had been over 40 years since I had seen a Webster boy and there they were! It meant so much to me and my siblings that they were there. After reading the Eulogy, Corey took me aside and said he felt I could have been reading the very same things I read about my Mom about his Mom Mona. Two young mothers, raising large families, with a deep faith in God and a love of life that kept them friends till the end. How lucky we all were to have them in our lives.
