“ My dad had many interests and passions one of which was interacting with animals. I’m pretty sure he generally preferred them to most people. When we were very young, my mother was not at that time a believer in mixing animals and children and since there were six of us kids, my dad felt he was not going to acquire a pet for a very long time. One day as our family was driving up to Leech Lake for a summer stay at my grandparents’ resort; my dad spotted a snapping turtle along the road. Surely, this poor creature needed to be rescued. The kids thought it was a great idea but my mom was not in agreement. I’m not sure which she objected to more, the turtle on the floor at her feet in the bucket snapping at her ankles or my brother throwing up in her lap because the turtle had taken over the bucket that my mom brought because my brother always threw up in the car on long trips. That particular turtle did not become a family pet but did inspire my dad to go out to the pet store one day (without consultation with my mother I’m sure) and purchase a box turtle. Of course my dad thought the turtle needed a special plastic turtle aquarium in which to live and all kinds of turtle treats and toys to fill his new environment. After the new addition was officially named "Ignatz" my dad proceeded to put him into his container and prod him to eat some of the turtle treats and explore his new pad. Ignatz wrinkled his nose at all the turtle delicacies my dad offered. Though I don’t think that turtles are supposed to be able to actually wrinkle their noses, this one seemed to have such a talent. Once he had snubbed all my dad’s treats he made it across the aquarium and then proceeded to snub my dad’s choice of housing for him as well. Ignatz simply climbed up and over the edge of his new abode and then walked away across the floor seeming to say, “Talk to the tail.” Never one to have unhappy animal friends, Dad worked really hard to figure out what made Ignatz happy and so Ignatz the box turtle dined on raw hamburger and apples and roamed our house freely, choosing to sleep in more comfortable surroundings such as the cool fireplace in the summer and under the warm radiator in the winter. Back in the early 1970’s my dad and Char had 23 cats living at their home. They originally started out with just 2 or 3 but that original crew quickly multiplied (without permission of course) into

23 with little effort. Ultimately I believe they ended up paring that group back down to about 10. One of the original cats was Dad's favorite cat of all time. His name was Thomas and he was a very fat red tabby who was Dad's kindred spirit. He often spoke of "Fat Thomas" and dearly missed him every single day after Thomas died. In the 1980's and 1990's my dad and Char volunteered every other Sunday at the Minnesota Zoo. There was not one animal that he didn't love and I think he had figured out by that time that it was easier to go to the zoo on Sundays than to live in a zoo every day. Over the last three months Dad was hospitalized on two occasions and each time he kept telling everyone that he was going to get better so he could go home to his fat pussy cats because they missed him as their warm-blooded furniture. As a matter of fact it was one of the last things he told the nurse just a couple of hours before he died. Dad didn't make it back to his home in Minnetonka as he had originally hoped but I'm quite certain that he is now at home and extremely happy in Heaven petting Fat Thomas and trying to please Ignatz, with his glass of Bombay in hand saying, "This ain't so bad!"
