They shared similar interests in history and enjoyed fishing off the dock and trips to the driving range. He was looking forward to Josh's graduation this spring. Kelsey is his baby girl. Bob loved watching her dance recitals. He really enjoyed watching how tough she was on the basketball court. He was impressed with her math and writing abilities, and we think he secretly liked helping her sell Girl Scout cookies too.

Bob enjoyed spending time watching sports and, when he was able, a round of golf with his brother Bill was always loved.

Even though he and Tami were still in the thick of raising their family, they dreamed of days to come; better health, kids graduating, empty nest, grandchildren, and eventually retiring to somewhere warm for the winters.

Everything he did, he did for his family. He worked hard to make sure they had everything they wanted. He was a good provider and did it with love. Bob was a decent person. He was honest and truthful. He was caring and helpful. He was gentle but strong. His shoulders were broad and he carried all of us. He is deeply loved.
