January 28, 1934 - March 31, 2021

Age 87 of Roseville, MN.

Passed away peacefully March 31, 2021 in the presence of his loving family at his home at EagleCrest.

Roger dedicated his life to serving children and families. He was the Director of Children's Services for Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese for seven years and Executive Director of the Children's Home Society of MN for 27 years. He was a leader on behalf of children in MN, the USA and Internationally, earning the Order of Civil Merit Moran Medal from the Republic of Korea, the University of St. Thomas Humanitarian Award and many more. Roger was an active long-time Roseville Citizen and St. Odilia Church volunteer, who worked on many projects to improve community life.

Preceded in death by his high school sweetheart and beloved wife, Marlys; his parents, Wayne and Grace and brothers, Jack and George Toogood.
