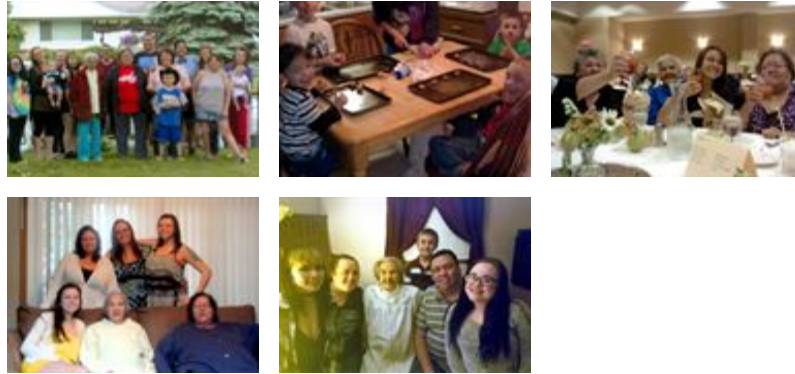

*Going to Pow Wows was a treat for me, I really loved them & auntie would show me how to do the circle dance (is that the right name) so when it was all nations I could go dance if I wanted to. She also showed my daughter's when they were like 8 I think. And encouraged them to go dance with Tanya Bishop & Kayla Bishop....she was just an all over wonderful woman.*

*I think of her as my aunt too, since I didn't have any family dynamic with blood relatives of my own.*
