Torgerson, Roslyn Bahr of Edina, Minnesota, died August 5, 2010 at the age of 72 after a 15-month battle with metastatic intranasal melanoma. Preceded in death by her parents, Vernal and Elvera Bahr; and husband of fifty years, Willard Torgerson. Survived by daughter, Rochelle Torgerson; son-in-law, Eapen Jacob; granddaughter, Bergen Jacob; and siblings, Carolyn (David) Moe and Richard (Kit) Bahr. Roslyn was born in Bemidji, Minnesota on August 30, 1937. She attended Bemidji High School, was elected Homecoming Queen by her peers and graduated in 1955. She received her bachelor's degree in 1959 from the University of Minnesota, Duluth having received her undergraduate education from several institutions including Taylor University in Indiana. Roslyn went on to obtain her Masters in Education from the University of Minnesota in 1968. She had a productive thirty-year career in home economics education, teaching at Nokomis Junior High and Mankato State University as well as working for the Minnesota Department of Education developing, writing and in-servicing curriculum. Roslyn shared her second career with her husband, Willard, as owners of Contemporary Furniture Showroom/Design Studio 1200 in Edina, Minnesota. Education and design were truly her loves. Roslyn influenced many, was deeply loved, and will be sadly missed, but she will stay in our hearts forever.
