Mould, Roy Thomas, Jr. Roy was born as Roy Thomas Mould Jr. on March 25th, 1935 to Roy Thomas Mould and Etta Radell Mould. Roy was born at home on Lincoln Ave in Chicago, Illinois. Roy was the first of 3 children followed by Annetta (Jamison) and Grant. Despite severe childhood health challenges Roy graduated from Knickerbocker Elementary School with honors. Roy attended Lane Technical High School a highly prestigious all boy's school. However, Roy chose to leave school early to help his family by working. Roy worked a variety of jobs and was always identified as a talented employee and promoted. Roy was drafted into the Army in December of 1958, but not before he asked his childhood friend Virginia ("Beanie") Carrera to marry him and they were engaged. Roy proudly served his country in Badenhausen Germany before being honorably discharged. Roy and Beanie started a family in 1964 with the birth of Roy Thomas Mould III and followed by Jeffery Scot Mould in 1968. Monica Pedroza, a family member from Mexico was added in 1973. Roy's adult years would show similar accomplishments and challenges to his childhood. Utilizing the Army's education benefits, Roy received his Bachelor's degree from Chicago Teacher's college and continued on to earn two Master's Degrees; one in Education and one in Abnormal Psychology. He continued to experience and overcome significant health challenges but true to form, Roy persevered and succeeded. Roy and Beanie bought a home in Oak Park Illinois and were once again part of a great neighborhood for raising their family. Roy and Beanie moved to Morton Grove

in retirement as Roy retired from the Chicago Board of Education after 35 years. They eventually moved to Minnesota in 2013 to be close to their two sons and to support their daughter in law Dawn Mould who was battling cancer. During Roy's teenage years he came to know Jesus Christ in a personal way and he would hold onto his faith to his dying day. Roy served in youth work, church work, Sunday School, Lake Geneva Youth Camp and in many quiet ways. Roy was loving and generous with his family, extended family and those around him who needed help. He enjoyed reading, learning, studying, fishing, traveling and time with family and friends. Roy went to his heavenly home on October 26th, 2020. Roy is survived by his wife "Beanie" and their two sons and their families as well as many in laws, nieces and nephews and friends.

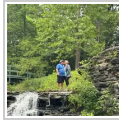
