I learned more “construction terms” than I ever needed (or could repeat in polite company) while we built the performance stage at the Eagle's Club. And of course, we'd take breaks from prepping Saturday night dinners to hit “the carwash.” Many Sundays started early with pancake breakfasts at the Eagle's—never all that profitable, always memorable.

Fishing with Russ and Stan Noggle was its own adventure. The motor on Russ' boat had a personality of its own - usually stubborn - and it usually took 45 minutes and repeating a lot of those construction terms just to get it started once we were on the lake. Getting home on time? Never happened.

And then there was “Putting on the Hitz” at the Eagle's Club. So much effort went into that two-hour show—and even more beverages went into building the courage to get on stage.

As life moved on, I didn't see Russ as often in recent years. But rarely did a day pass without something reminding me of him—a quote, a moment, a memory. He was woven into so many great times.

*Gonna miss ya, Russ.
Save me a Mich Golden.*
