I met her at her home - my church sent a volunteer group to help her rake leaves, take out trash, etc. I happened to live less than a mile away on Irving Ave at that time and Sondra and I became fast friends. We regularly spent time together going out to eat at Lunds and Byerlys, shopping at Cub and Herbergers, and talking about our favorite TV shows and life. Sondra got to know my family, helped me through boyfriend troubles, got to know my boyfriend turned husband who also loved her dearly. I moved to Virginia in 2010 but regularly visited Minnesota and always came to visit her when we were there. She came to my bridal shower, baby showers, and, while we didn't get to see each other as often after I moved away, we remained close friends, talking regularly. She refused to let me call her a second grandma - she was my aunt, her "friend on Penn". She was a spit fire who wasn't afraid to state her opinion. She was smart and funny and loving and loyal. She loved her mother more than anyone in the world. My husband and I consider her family. I'm crying as I write this. I recently thought of her and called her phone and worried when it rang and rang. I'm so sad to learn Sondra is gone and so glad to know she died peacefully as I know she suffered through illness toward the end of her life. She was a beautiful friend. She was consistently encouraging and loving to me and I will absolutely miss her presence in my life, her hilarious and wonderful voicemails, and our visits. I'm so glad we got to see her this summer in August, that she got to meet both of my children, and that I have one last memory with her shopping at The Bag Lady in NE. I bought a necklace there that day and now it holds even more meaning. I will remember her sitting at her table surrounded by the trinkets she loved, pictures of me and my kiddos and others - and I'll particularly remember when she used to decorate for Halloween.
