Scott Leonard Langlie, age 64, of Arden Hills, passed away Sept. 7, 2021. Scott is survived by his loving wife, Sonja; children, Mali (Matt) Hunt, Esten and Jason; granddaughter, Ava Hunt; sister, Barb (Tom) Koch; nieces and nephews. Scott was preceded in death by his parents, Lucille and Leonard. Scott passed away peacefully in the hospital, surrounded by family after sustaining injuries in an accident while mountain biking with his son, Esten. His family deeply appreciates the valiant efforts of fellow mountain bikers and first responders who came to his aid. Scott did not suffer in his passing and went out doing what he loved, capping off a great weekend at the lake with some adventure sport with those he loved most.

Scott was a lifelong athlete, making waves as an NCAA Division 1 Track and Field competitor at the University of Minnesota. He didn't stop at the 400, though, but also ran the Twin Cities Marathon, a challenging feat for a sprinter. He poured himself into rock climbing, water skiing, canoeing, cross-country skiing, downhill skiing, soccer, hiking, mountain biking, and just about any other sport he could. His love for the outdoors and sport were contagious and many of his best moments were sharing these loves with Sonja, Mali, Esten, Jason, and anyone else he could bring along, from exploring the boundary waters to carving new paths down great mountains from the Alps to the Rockies and more.

Scott was also an outstanding mechanical engineer, impacting countless lives at work, where he served over 40 years with BAE Systems. He applied those

skills at home too, eagerly fixing anything he got his hands on, building the family lake place with his dad, and working on cars and bikes with his sons. Through all his work, hobbies, and passions, Scott always put God and family first. He was a long-time member of Bethlehem Baptist Church, serving in a variety of ways over the years, and regularly gave his time, energy, and resources to missions, doing disaster relief work around the world. He loved and served God humbly and obediently, serving as a shining example for so many.

Scott also shone in his role as husband to Sonja for the past 34 years and father to Mali, Esten, and Jason for the past few decades. In more recent years, he took his son-in-law, Matt, in and treated him as one of his own, and was the kindest of grandfathers to sweet Ava Joy, not to mention his constant service as a staple of the extended family, selflessly loving parents, siblings, nieces, and nephews.

Scott was a great and faithful man, and he will be dearly missed here on Earth, even as he hears, "Well done, good and faithful servant," and enters into the joy of the Master for eternity.
