Parker Shirley Elizabeth Groom Parker, age 83, Mpls, of cancer, on Saturday August 13, 2005 with her children at her bedside. Preceded in death by parents, James Warner Groom and Ethel Bernice Kohlhaas Groom. Survived by daughter, Patricia Parker (Lee Charlton) of California; sons, Christopher of Wyoming and Richard (Susan) of Hopkins; grandsons, Harvey and Ian; stepdaughter, Bonnie Field, of Mpls.
