Dr. Shyam Sunder Chadha, professor of mathematics, peacefully joined heavenly abode in Saint Paul, MN on Saturday, October 22, 2016. Best known for teaching thousands of young minds and shaping the next generation of leaders.

Praised by admirers for his intellectual curiosity and playful approach to mathematics and his life's work earned him many honors. Dr. Chadha completed his PhD in mathematics at Delhi University Hans Raj College where he later taught as a mathematics professor. He retired in 2014 from University of Wisconsin where he taught for over 20 years and after retirement, moved to Woodbury, MN.

Dr. Chadha, meant a lot of things to different people; however, to all he was humble, simple, gregarious, personable, and fearless.

He was preceded by his parents, Sri Daulat Ram Chadha and Sri Krishna Vanti Anand.

He is survived by his loving wife of 43 years, Veena, two daughters, Sonia Chadha Agarwal and Monica Chadha Stiles; sons in law, Amit Agarwal and Matthew Lee Stiles; grandchildren Esha, Mansi, Anuj, Rohan, and Nimisha. They lovingly played with him and called him Nanuji.
