Steven (Steve) Showcatally, age 52, of Eagan Minnesota, passed away July 2021. Steve was born on May 15th 1969 to Bebe (Mathieu) and Azad (Baksh) Showcatally. Steve grew-up in Eagan and attended Rosemount Middle School and Rosemount High School.

After high school graduation Steve joined the Air Force and was stationed at Lowry AFB (Colorado) and Hill AFB (Utah). He was also deployed to the Gulf war (Desert Storm) where he was stationed in the United Arab Emirates.

Steve deeply valued his service and was an honor graduate at both his basic training and tech school. Additionally, he earned: two Bronze Stars, an Air Force Meritorious Achievement Medal and a National Defense Medal. Steve ended his military career at Hill AFB where he received awards for Airman of the Unit, Squadron, Wing, and Base.

Another of Steve's passions was spending time with family and friends. He loved walking around Lake Nokomis - alone, with family, or with friends. He often said that walking around Lake Nokomis made him "feel free." He also loved going out with, and

having a talk with, his aunts and uncles - especially over a good Chinese lunch. Another of Steve's passions was the Minnesota Vikings - Go Vikes! He must have also been an eternal optimist.

Steve is survived by his Mother Bebe (Mike) Mathieu, Father Azad Baksh, Brothers Shawn (Kim) Showcatally, Paul (Holley) Mathieu, Sister Michelle (Chris) Wiechmann and Grandfather Baksh. He is also survived by many loving aunts and uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews.
