As he grew older, his "deep woods" got bigger (Rice Creek Park), and his preferred mode of transportation switched to trail bikes, BMX, and even motorbikes...but the love for being outside was the same. He loved learning the land, improving the existing trails, and figuring out how to build ramps and jumps to get himself across obstacles (or sometimes just for fun).

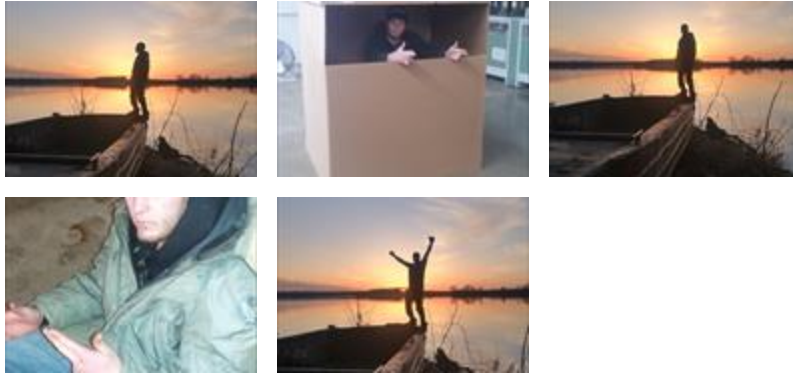
