While a resident in Ypsilanti, Michigan, she was an active member of St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Beyer Memorial Hospital Auxiliary, Ypsilanti Women's Literary Club and volunteer at the Ypsilanti Thrift Shop which provided donations to the community. She moved to Edina after retirement, to be closer to her family and was an active member of the Women's Club of Minneapolis. She was a tennis champion in her early years in Detroit and Ypsilanti, and continued to play locally in Edina. She was preceded in death by her father, John Haviland; mother, Ellen Wortley Haviland Longnecker; step father, Alexander Longnecker; and former husband, Dr. Rudolph Powers McCulloch.
