Jack, PhD, Susan M. age 69, of Bloomington, passed away March 31 from complications of COVID-19, colon cancer and a double lung transplant. Survived by her beloved wife, Kim Kammeier; daughters, Jennie (Tony) Eiden and Cassie (Joel) Bonstrom; and four granddaughters, "Mouse" Molly and "Sweet P" Paige Eiden, "Madster" Maddie and "Doodle" Mack Bonstrom. Susan was born and raised in Pennsylvania, and lived in the Washington, D.C. area before starting a family in Minnesota. She retired from a 40-year career as a Marriage and Family Therapist, a vocation she loved dearly, where she helped hundreds of people lead healthier and more fulfilling lives. Her warmth, compassion and thoughtfulness were evident in every interaction and relationship she had. Thirty-five years ago, she found the love of her life and together Susan and Kim showed those around them the true definition of partnership, commitment and devotion. They legally married in August 2013. On December 1, 2018, Susan received the gift of organ donation after fighting Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis. She courageously faced extensive complications after her double lung transplant, but she continued to fight and overcome each one, all in an effort to have more time with her family. They are eternally grateful for those extra 16 months together. They were difficult months, but months also filled with comforting conversations about enduring love and resilience, cherished weekly family dinners together and giggles from four little girls who reminded them all of what is important in life. A memorial service will be held at a later date when all those who knew and loved Susan
