“ I have been thinking a lot about Tom. Every home leave I had, he would phone and we'd talk for a hour. He was a good athlete in the seminary, especially playing guard in basketball. He lost a tooth or two playing ice hockey, and the priest who was in charge of expenses was a cheap pup, so Tom wound up with an ill fitting plate that would emit a whistle when he talked. I'd kid him about it until I got my front teeth snapped off while catching a ball game later that spring. Same dentist and the same result. We had over 120 seminarians then, so they had to make single kneelers and put two between each radiator.
