



## Thomas Gregory Loucks

August 10, 1944 - August 21, 2022

Thomas G. Loucks died on Sunday, August 21, at the age of 78, due to complications from surgery to repair a broken hip.

Tom treasured his family, his many friends, and his colleagues. He was passionate about open wheel dirt car racing, golf, politics, and his Corvette. He was a wise, well-read man who relished sharing a good story. Tom developed life-long friendships during his years playing kitten ball, car racing, golfing, and founding Tom Loucks & Associates, which is proudly in its 46th year of business.

Tom is survived by his life partner of 37 years, Jeannie Baumann, sister Virginia, daughter Jennifer, son Jeffrey, granddaughter Reagan, grandson Jackson, niece Carol, nephews Joe and Ken, and many cousins. Tom was preceded in death by parents, Lily and Joseph Loucks, and stepson Christopher Baumann.

Born in Rockford, Illinois on August 10, 1944, Tom grew up in Dubuque, IA. After graduating in 1962 from Dubuque Senior High School, Tom enlisted in the Marines and served in Vietnam. Tom attended Minnesota Mankato State and graduated in 1970 with a degree in urban studies.

In 1976, Tom founded Tom Loucks & Associates, with a focus on city

planning. He went on to add civil engineering, land surveying, and landscape architecture. Tom loved working with people, and created a collaborative, supportive atmosphere, a company culture which continues to this day. The firm he built reflected his own personality: honest, humble, and authentic. Tom was a gifted, generous man and will be especially remembered for his deep laugh lines, generous heart, and contagious zest for life.
