Bredow, Virgil Wayne age 89, passed away on May 28, 2013 at the Mpls Veterans Home. Born in Denver, IA on Feb. 3, 1924 to Laura and Max Bredow. Married Vernett Smith in Waterloo, IA on June 8, 1947. Survived by wife of Eden Prairie, MN; son, Steven (Debbie) Bredow of Waterloo; sister, Laretta (Vincent) Cutler of Waterloo; also 6 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren.
