“ I was saddened to do a google search and find that Mr. Kedrovsky had passed away. Another Edina math teacher had just passed away, Curtiss Johnson, and I wondered about Mr. Kedrovsky. I was in his Calculus Prep And Calculus classes in my junior and senior high school math classes at Edina High School. Mr. Kedrovsky (The Perfect Circler) was a big influence in my life. I was one of 20 students out of over 800 in our graduating class to be chosen for the two year advanced math classes to take calculus. I came from a Catholic grade school and took two years of algebra in summer school to catch up to the advanced group. I was going to be a math teacher and football coach, but differential equations at the University of Minnesota did me in. Long story short, I became a metallurgical engineer and spent 13 years at the GE locomotive plant in Erie, PA designing railroad locomotives. I have spent the last 25 years as a railroad expert in investigating derailments and accident reconstruction since I read and interpret the locomotive black boxes.
