Strobel W. Robert (Bob) Strobel, age 79. Bob was born on August 7, 1925, at Wirch, North Dakota, and grew up in Montana. He joined the Army Air Corps during World War II, and later became a chaplain in the Air Force Reserves. He earned degrees from Yankton College, Yankton School of Theology, and Yale Divinity School. He later received a doctorate from Columbia University and Union Seminary in New York City. He served parishes in Sioux Falls and Honolulu, Hawaii and interims in Sioux Falls and Colorado Springs. He was a professor at United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities from 1962-1987. After retiring, Bob remained active and involved in the community and in his church, Plymouth Congregational. Bob's life was marked by his extraordinary love and concern for people; by his profound embrace of life; by his commitment to his faith and to his family; and by his passion for flying. Bob was a private pilot for more than 30 years. He is survived by his loving and devoted wife of 55 years, Alice Strobel; by numerous nieces and nephews, and by all those whose lives he touched so deeply.
