Camp, Warren Kenneth

Age 83 of Bloomington, Minnesota, passed away unexpectedly on January 30, 2025. Born February 5, 1941 in Kearney, NE to Leon and Edna Camp and grew up in Gibbon, NE and graduated from Gibbon HS in 1959. He graduated with a B.A. from Sioux Falls College (now USF) in 1963 and went on to earn an M.A. from the University of Nebraska Kearney with further studies at the University of Minnesota.

Warren retired after 32 years from the Richfield Public Schools as a teacher and coach. He spent eighteen summers directing Hope Church's Camp Ojibway in Siren, Wisconsin where he impacted the lives of hundreds of campers.

A member of Hope Church in Richfield for 52 years, he served faithfully as an elder, deacon, youth ministry group leader, and membership in the OASIS learning community. In addition, he served as a BSF leader, a mentor through Prison Fellowship, and as a member of six short-term mission teams.

Warren enjoyed trout fishing, camping, golfing, pheasant and turkey hunting, traveling, sports, and time with family and friends. He is survived by his wife Joyce (61 years), sons CJ of Mpls, Corey (Tara), and granddaughter Kyah of

Sioux Falls, SD, and grandson Cayden of Mankato. He is also survived by many other family members and friends. He was preceded in death by his parents and brother Dr. Raymond Camp.

A memorial service will be held Friday, February 7, at Hope Church, 7132 Portland Ave. S., Richfield, MN 55423 at 11:00 a.m. with visitation one hour earlier. A luncheon will follow the service.
