Case Company, and married Virginia J. Karr. In 1957, Warren and Virginia moved to Edina, MN where they raised their family. Warren and Virginia were exemplary parents whose dedication to their children continued to give love and attention to grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Each of us has strong memories of the many ways they cared for their family. We all recognized how fortunate we were to have had such remarkable parents and a close family. Warren and Virginia moved to Waverly Gardens (Presbyterian Homes) in

2006. The family recognizes the staff and residents there who provided care, compassion and joy to Warren.
