Wren, William C. "Bill" Passed away very suddenly at his home in Burnsville on Friday at the age of 65. He is survived by his loving wife of 34 years, Linda. In the past year, they traveled to numerous exotic locations around the world and often visited their beloved beach house in Manzanita, Oregon. A 25 year employee of Northwest Airlines, he rose to be Vice President of Corporate Relations. He currently worked for the MAC as the Business Development Officer and was responsible for attracting new airlines to serve MSP. His latest successes were adding Southwest and Alaska Airlines to this market. With his devotion to aviation, he served on the board and as a former president of the Airport Foundation MSP, an agency that helps the airport better serve the public through art, music, landscaping, travelers assistance and children's play areas. As a highly respected and knowledgeable PR professional, Bill was a leader of the Twin Cities Communications Council, a group of top level media and public relations executives that help shape the public discourse of our community. He was always willing to share his expertise for any worthwhile project or event. Bill supported athletics at all levels and was a member and former head of Twin Cities Dunkers, an organization that promotes and recognizes athletes and teams in our area. He most enjoyed chairing the scholarship committee of Dunkers that awards a male and female public school graduate up to a four year college scholarship. A caring, compassionate person, Bill was a dedicated volunteer for Operation Smile. With his connections and hard work, he helped countless children with birth

defects "to smile" and live a normal life. All who were privileged to know Bill will always remember his positive attitude and big smile. To know him was to be his friend. Bill was a giant in this community and leaves it a better place. He will be missed, but never forgotten. Survived by sister, Patricia Wren; brothers, Anthony and Jonathan Wren; and many relatives and friends. Service will be held Tuesday, December 23rd at 2:00 pm at Washburn-McReavy Edina Chapel, West 50th Street & Highway 100. Visitation will be from 12:00 noon to 2:00 pm prior to the service.
