



## Rev. William A. Livingston

Livingston, The Reverend William Alexander age 74, a Presbyterian minister, passed away February 4, 2013 in Minneapolis. Born in Elizabeth, NJ, Bill graduated from Miami University (BA, English, 1960), San Francisco Theol. Sem. (M.Div., 1963) and University of MN (MFA, theater, 1969). He served as associate or interim minister at churches in MN, IA, CA, and WA; as Interim Executive Presbyter (Presbytery of SD), Director of Major Gifts (Macalester College), and President of Luther Child Center (Everett, WA). He was active in the Presbytery of the Twin Cities as Co-Chair of the Committee on Ministry, and member of the Presbytery Council. Bill was very proud of his contribution as Artistic Director of the Theater of Involvement (Minneapolis, MN, 1967-1976). A loving father and grandfather, with his late wife Ethel Kay, he attended countless sporting events, concerts, and eventually graduations. Survived by sister Grace Stansfield (Roger) of Roseville, California; daughter Sherryl (James Lundy) of St. Paul; son Kirk (Jaime Cid) of San Francisco, CA; grandchildren Sean and Rose; nieces and nephews. A memorial service is planned for 1 PM, Saturday February 16, at Westminster Presbyterian Church, Minneapolis, reception following.
