Rogers, William C. - Age 86 Formerly of NE Minneapolis Began his teaching career at the University of Chicago, where he received his undergraduate and doctorate degrees in Political Science and International Relations. He also taught at the University of Virginia, the Western Reserve University and the University of Minnesota, where he directed the World Affairs Center from 1949-1984, when he retired. During his retirement, he served as a consultant to the Minnesota International Center. Dr. Rogers has been active in many professional and civic organizations. He has served as secretary-treasurer of the National University Extension Association and was past president of the Society for Citizen Education in World Affairs. He was past chair of the Minneapolis Committee on Urban Environment (CUE). In 1981-82, he was president of World Trade Week Inc. He was also a founding member of the Livable Winter City Association. From 1951-1973, Dr. Rogers served as director of the Minneapolis Star & Tribune's Program of Information on World Affairs. He is the author of 'A Guide to Understanding World Affairs' (1966) and 'Global Dimension of U.S. Education: The Community' (1972) and co-author of 'The Winter City Book' (1980) and has written numerous articles for professional journals. In 1978, he organized the first conference on 'The Livable Winter City' and has lectured and done research on the subject in the USA, Canada, Japan and Europe. He is listed in 'Who's Who in America' and the 'Dictionary of International Biography'. Born March 12, 1919 in Manhattan, KS. Married his wife, Mary Jane Anderson in 1941. He is survived by

daughters, Shelly Kancitis, Faith Monson and Mary Kniaz; 7 grandchildren.
