Of Arden Hills, MN, formerly of Duluth, MN died January 16, 2024. Winnifred was born to the late Joseph and Julia Winkelman in Foley, MN on December 4, 1929. After graduation from the College of St. Scholastica in Duluth, she did graduate work in history, receiving an M.A. and Ph.D. from Loyola University in Chicago. From 1949 until 1975 she was a member of St. Scholastica Monastery in Duluth. After teaching in grade school and high school in Hibbing, Cincinnati, Chicago and Duluth, Winnifred taught history at the College of St. Scholastica where she won the Lavine Award for Teaching Excellence (1986) and the Scholastica Inspiration Award (2006). After retirement in 1998 Winnifred relocated to Arden Hills. Winnifred had a lifelong passion for learning and for teaching, volunteering in the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at the University of Minnesota. She is survived by her sister-in-law, Sylvia Winkelman and many nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by sisters, Mary LuAnn Seidel and Honore Winkelman; brothers, J. Brian and John Winkelman; brother-in-law, Raymond Seidel; sister-in-law, Eleanor Winkelman; and Winnifred's lifelong friend, Mary Quinlivan.
